

# Town of Pelham Board Update September 2023

Dear Pelham Friends and Neighbors:

Happy Fall!! While it's a busy time of year, we hope that you are all taking the time to enjoy some of the upcoming festivities throughout the Town, including Novel Night this coming Saturday and the Pelham Children's center <u>Pumpkin Festival</u> on October 14<sup>th</sup> at Gazebo Park.

In the coming weeks, the Town will be preparing its 2024 budget. A public hearing on the budget will take place at the December 4th Town Board meeting, with approval to take place at the December 18th meeting (if necessary). The most significant budget item will be for the new contract with Town of Eastchester for a **dedicated ambulance**, as well as the operation of our current EMS Fly Car vehicle. While we expect that this may mean going over the 2% tax cap (which the Board approved by Local Law #2 at the September Board meeting), we believe that having our own dedicated ambulance is a critical service for the health and safety of our community. We would like to extend our tremendous gratitude to the many community members who have been good partners and provided support and feedback throughout this process. This includes Pelham Village Fire Chief Robert Benkwitt, and community members Ray Florida, Gene Ianuzzi, as well as Katie Keenan, Ashley Mills, Katy Yang, Brittney Price and Jennifer Iacono, to name a few. We would also like to thank NYS Senator Nathalia Fernandez and Assemblywoman Amy Paulin for securing approximately \$450,000 grants for the purchase of a new ambulance.

## Supervisor's Report

The Town is working through the contract with Eastchester to commence its ambulance and EMS services on January 1, 2024. At the September 11<sup>th</sup> Board Meeting, the Town approved Local Law #2 to override the 2% tax cap, which will likely be needed to support the new contract. The Town has received close to \$450,000 in funding from State Senator Nathalia Fernandez and Amy Paulin for the purchase of our own ambulance, which it hopes will defray the cost of the services.

Supervisor McLaughlin was proud to report that on September 9th, he awarded an Eagle Scout proclamation to Pelham student Liam Mead. For his Eagle Scout Project Liam oversaw the installation of a safety upgrade to the church playground which is used daily by the Montessori School, parishioners, and members of the wider community.

#### Clerk's Office
